2. VFP Arlington Michigan Display In Downtown Detroit On Memorial Day - May 31st



Veterans For Peace Chapters 74 and 93 have again joined forces to set up the Veterans For Peace Arlington Michigan display (one grave marker for every Michigan soldier killed in the Afghan and Iraq wars – 230 total) in downtown Detroit on Memorial Day. The purpose of this display is to honor those who have fallen, to provide a place to grieve, and to educate the public about the costs of war, as well as the needs of those returning from conflicts. The display will be held on Monday, May 31st, 11am to 5pm, in downtown Detroit's Grand Circus

Park (Woodward at East Adams – map link at https://goo.gl/maps/MjhWcB4ospmmwwFu6).

Volunteers are very much needed to help set up the display starting at 10am (assemble in Grand Circus Park by the dog park area near Woodward) with setup taking an hour. Additional volunteers are needed to staff the display throughout the day and also take the display down at 5pm (takes around a 1/2 hour). The name of the event is We Stand With Our Neighbors Immigration Vigil This weekly vigil was stared in response to school children in Southwest Detroit whose teachers and counselors are deeply concerned about the trauma students are experiencing as they face the threat and reality of detention and deportations. Our message is: No deportations! No ban! No wall! No harassment and intimidation!

The vigil is hosted by the Sisters of Mercy; IHM Sisters; Pax Christi Michigan; Detroit Marygrove Pax Christi; Amnesty International - Detroit Chapter; University of Detroit Jesuit JustPeace; Friends of Immigrants; Congregation of St. Joseph; Home Visitors of Mary; Detroit Metro Interfaith Worker Justice; Neighbors and Educators from Southwest Detroit.
